Deposits and Booking

Frequently Asked Questions.

Which night do Beavers camp and is it the same price for them? As Beavers are only permitted to camp one night, we would suggest they stay on the Saturday night. This means if they arrive on Saturday morning,



they get an extra eight hours at the event compared to staying Friday to Saturday; they do not miss out on any of the activities or evening entertainment, and Leaders can arrive on Friday, set up their areas in plenty of time and stay overnight. For these reasons, the price is the same for all sections.

• Can day visitors still achieve the Environmental Partnership Award?

They can, but the Environmental Partnership Award is being offered as an alternative to the safari park—you cannot do both!

Can day visitors choose between Saturday and Sunday?

Either day is fine, however, Saturday would be preferred as it is the main activity day and there will be more on offer.

Is the entrance charge the same for leaders/ helpers/parents?

There is one fixed charge of £30 for camping or

£15 for day visit regardless of age, as adults will be able to participate in the activities and entertainment (providing age restrictions don't apply, like on the Adventure Playground!). Please note, any adults camping overnight need a valid CRB disclosure.

Can equipment be dropped off before the event starts?

Equipment can be dropped off at designated points on Thursday, but tents cannot be pitched and no one is able to stay overnight. Areas will be marked out on Friday morning and group areas can be set up from midday.
